## RATING RATIONALE

WCRCL has assigned **WCRSME3** (pronounced as WASO Credit Rating Small & Medium Enterprise Three) rating under the SME Rating to Maa Babar Doya Cloth Store (hereinafter referred as "MBDCS" or "The Enterprise") based on its financial and other relevant qualitative and quantitative information up-to the date of the rating issuance.

The above rating has been assigned based on the fundamentals of the enterprise which includes:

- Experienced and skilled management
- Satisfactory banking relationship

- Low levered capital structure
- Good interest coverage position

However, the above rating has been moderated to some extent due to some factors like:

- Tight liquidity position with long cash conversion cycle
- No insurance coverage for the inventory in stock
- Lack of disclosure in the financial statements
- Low management information system (MIS) and Manual accounting system
- No insurance coverage

The SME rating implies that the enterprise is adjudged to above average credit quality to other small & medium enterprises.

WCRCL also viewed the enterprise with "Stable" outlook and believes that MBDCS will be able to maintain its good fundamentals in the foreseeable future.
