

RATING RATIONALE

WCRCL has assigned 'WCRSME3' (pronounced as WASO Credit Rating Small Enterprise Three) rating under the SME Rating to Zara International (hereinafter referred as "ZI" or "The Enterprise") based on its financial and other relevant qualitative and quantitative information up-to the date of the rating issuance.

The above rating has been assigned based on the fundamentals of the enterprise which includes:

- Owned business premises and storage facility
- Satisfactory banking relationship
- Good business network
- Good interest coverage position
- Low levered capital structure

However, the above rating has been moderated to some extent due to some factors like:

- Tight liquidity position with long cash conversion cycle
- No insurance coverage
- Low disclosure of financial statements
- Low management information system (MIS) and Manual accounting system

The SME rating implies that the Enterprise has above Average Credit Quality.

WCRCL also viewed the enterprise with "Stable" outlook and believes that ZI will be able to maintain its good fundamentals in the foreseeable future.
