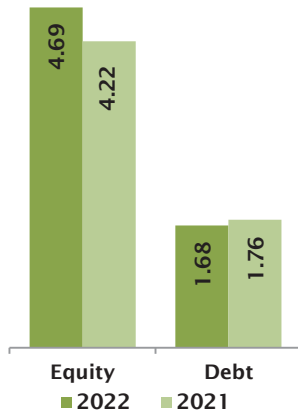

RATING RATIONALE

WCRCL has reaffirmed ‘WCRSME3’ (pronounced as WASO Credit Rating Small and Medium Enterprise Three) rating under the SME Rating to Atifa Jahan Plastic (hereinafter referred as “AJP” or “The Enterprise”) based on its financial and other relevant qualitative and quantitative information up-to the date of the rating issuance.

The above rating has been assigned based on the fundamentals of the enterprise which includes:

- Satisfactory banking relationship
- Good mortgage security coverage against loan
- Good business network
- Regular loan repayment history
- Long experience track of the proprietor
- Good interest coverage position
- Low levered capital structure

However, the above rating has been moderated to some extent due to some factors like:

- Tight liquidity position with long cash conversion cycle
- Rented business premises and storage facility
- No disclosure of financial statements
- Low management information system (MIS) and Manual accounting system

The SME rating implies that the enterprise has above average credit quality.

WCRCL also viewed the enterprise with “Stable” outlook and believes that AJP will be able to maintain its good fundamentals in the foreseeable future. This rating may be revised in case of any extraordinary changes in line with the sponsor’s equity investment, debt obligations, management, business operations and/or changes in any macro and micro factors in the economy.
